600 Yard Course This distance is used for all dogs that do not run the 300-yard Course. A veteran dog may run 400 yards at the owner's discretion. A dog must complete this course in less than 2 minutes. If there is a question whether a dog should run the 300 or 600-yard course, the judge will decide.

PASSING PERFORMANCE. The Coursing Ability Test is a pass–fail event. To pass, the dog must complete the course with enthusiasm and without interruption within the maximum amount of time for the course length. A dog is considered to have failed the test if it relieves while on course. The time ends when the dog completes the required course. The judge keeps the official time and decides the merits of the dog's performance.

TITLING: Coursing Ability (CA) – Awarded to a dog that passes the Coursing Ability Test three times under at least two different judges. Coursing Ability Advanced (CAA) – Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test a total of ten times. (CA+7 additional passes)

Coursing Ability Excellent (CAX) – Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test a total of 25 times.

Coursing Ability Excellent 2 (CAX2) – Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test a total of 50 times.

FIT DOG

AWARDS: Fit Dog Rosette per walk completed **Limited to 20 dogs per walk** (if a lot of interest, we will add a second walk on Saturday afternoon)

ROUTE: From 23456 Chat Blanc Lane down Chat Blanc Lane then turn right onto Fauntleroy, stopping at the assigned spot for a brief break and then return. 1.1 miles (see photo)

Line up & Sign up will be at 9:30. Walk will begin at 9:45. Round trip should take about 30 minutes.

Bitches in season As a courtesy, bitches in season should not be taken to group activities such as fitness classes or activities where other dogs are present. Examples include community runs and hikes. If it is possible, bitches in season may run or walk after the group.

Age of dogs Dogs must be at least 6 months old to earn the Bronze AKC FIT DOG title. Dogs must be registered or enrolled with AKC and have an AKC, PAL, or AKC Canine Partners number when the Title Application is submitted.

All dogs must be leashed ~ At AKC FIT DOG activities, dogs may wear slip collars, buckle collars, Martingales, and body harnesses. They may not wear prong collars or e-collars. Muzzles may be worn only in events that permit muzzles. Head collars may be worn unless they are prohibited by a specific activity for safety reasons (e.g., when a dog is running the agility course, the only collars allowed are flat buckle or rolled leather collars). Leashes should be 4 ft. to 6 ft. long and should be made of fabric or leather.

Paperwork – How to Submit Your Titles Owner: Once the dog has earned the required number of points to earn a title, the dog owner should send to AKC 1) a copy of the AKC FIT DOG Title Application with the fee for the title, 2) the checklist for each of the 6 categories showing the points earned and 3) all of the necessary documentation described in Part II. The paperwork may be mailed to the address or email address at the top of the title application, or preferably, it may be submitted online to the Title Application Portal (TAP). TAP allows you to submit the paperwork and fee as well as track the progress of the title. https://www.apps.akc.org/title-application-portal/

EVENT DAY PROCEDURES

Each dog will be inspected by the Inspection Committee for lameness, fitness to compete, and females in season. All dogs to be inspected must be presented without tape, bandages, or wrapping/coverings of any kind (coats, blankets, etc.). If, in the opinion of the inspection committee, a dog is found to be lame, unfit to compete, or in season, the dog will not be allowed to test, and the applicable entry fees will be refunded.

All entrants will assemble in a designated location. At this time, test procedures will be explained, and any questions answered.

Dogs will be brought to the start line on leash and released only upon a verbal signal ("Tally-Ho!") from the Huntmaster. Dogs may be released by hand, folded leash, or using a traditional lure coursing slip lead.

Dogs may run with or without a collar for safety reasons. Unacceptable collars are choker collar, prong collar, or electronic collar. Tags, bandanas, or other similar items are not allowed for safety reasons. Owners may use clips or rubber bands to hold the dog's hair. The owner assumes responsibility for the safety of the dog regarding the dog's collar and paraphernalia on the dog. Electronic training collars or pinch/prong collars are NOT allowed on AKC test grounds.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Brian Batista of *Brian Batista Photography* is the official photographer for these events. No other photographer will be allowed to photograph dogs/people without the express consent of Brian Batista Photography

and the Field Trial Chairman. (Only exception is persons with cell phones and their own dogs). Anyone caught photographing these events, or any portion thereof, without permission will be asked to leave the field. An AKC Event Committee hearing may also be called if unsportsmanlike behavior is

CAT/CABT

COURSE DESIGN. The course shall be designed with safety for non-sighthound breeds as a primary consideration. There shall be no turns more acute than 90 degrees. The total length of the course shall be no less than 600 yards and should be as close to 600 yards as is possible. The lure will consist of plastic strips. Depending on the size and type of dog, the dog will run either the full course or a 300-yard course. The 300-yard distance shall be clearly marked. Safety is of utmost importance.

The judge is responsible for walking the course prior to the start of the event to look for hazards.

DISTANCE AND MAXIMUM TIME. Dogs run singularly in Coursing Ability Test events. Veteran dogs may run two-thirds of the normal distance at the owner's discretion. Veteran dogs are defined for this test as dogs older than 7 years of age. A veteran dog's owner must declare prior to the start which distance the dog will run.

300 Yard Course This distance is for dogs shorter than 12 inches at the withers and/or brachycephalic ("flat-faced") dogs. A veteran dog may run 200 yards at the owner's discretion. A dog must complete this course in less than 11/2 minutes.

Dogs can be any age.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered/listed with the AKC. This includes dogs recorded in the FSS program, dogs with PAL numbers or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. (An event number defines an event.)
- Lure Equipment: Battery-powered, continuous loop equipment will be used. Lures consist of white plastic bags. Electronic break-thebeam timing system will be used with manual timing as a backup for equipment failure and rainy weather.
- For the safety of the dog and as a courtesy to other entrants, a
 testing dog should have a reliable recall. A penalty of \$20.00 may be
 assessed for any dog causing an excessive delay of the event
 because it cannot be recalled or retrieved from the field. Dogs that
 delay the event because their owners cannot recall them may be
 refused entry at future events.
- You will be charged \$5.00 if you do not pick up after your dog.
- These events will be run concurrently. Dogs that have not yet run will have priority over dogs that will be running for the second test.
- Event is held in rain-or-shine outdoor event. Please plan accordingly.
- Dogs should be walked prior to running to warm them up and again after their run to cool them down.
- Dogs must be on lead or crated unless running.
- Handlers should wear comfortable shoes and be physically able to hold and release their dogs, as well as catch them.
- Lure coursing is a physically demanding sport so please make sure your dog is in good shape. Dogs that are overweight and/or out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and exhaustion. The Inspection Committee has the authority to disallow a dog's entry into a test, and in such instances, applicable entry fees will be refunded.
- Any person, upon reasonable complaint, may be asked to leave the grounds of the test by the Field Committee and may be disciplined by the AKC. Children must always be under control of their parents or guardian(s).
- Each dog requires an entry form.
- Late, incomplete, unsigned, unpaid, or conditional entries, or entries not containing the "Agreement" found on the Official AKC Entry Form will not be accepted.

- Mixed breeds must be spayed or neutered to be eligible to run. AKC registered dogs with breed disqualifications may be entered.
- No entry fees will be refunded if the event cannot be started or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and/or dangerous weather conditions, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club or its members and representatives.
- No refunds for early entry fees unless the entered dog upon inspection is lame, unfit to compete, or in season.
- A return check fee of \$40.00 will be assessed for any check(s) returned for insufficient funds.

Day-of entries will be taken from 09:00 AM provided there is space available in either test. Day-of entry fee will be \$45/per dog/per run. Please note it takes two test passes to earn the title, so the cost is per test. Online entries are available at Blackknightscoursing.com. If you enter online, you will be required to sign the agreement on site.

Confirmations and judging schedule will be sent by e-mail only.

All fees payable to Black Knights Coursing.

If sending entries overnight, make sure to sign waiver that allows the delivery person to leave packages without a signature. Requiring a signature will only delay receipt of your entries.

Returned Checks do not constitute a valid entry and will be subject to a \$40 collection fee. Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms and no entry will be refunded in the event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date. Canine Good Citizen Test Items

1. Accepting a friendly stranger

Evaluator approaches and pretends to shake hands with handler (hands 6- 12" apart). Evaluator does not touch dog.

2. Sitting politely for petting

Evaluator pets dog; dog must show no shyness or resentment.

3. Appearance and grooming

Evaluator inspects dog, combs or brushes lightly, examines ears and each front foot.

4. Out for a walk

Handler takes dog for a short walk including right turn, left turn, about turn and stop.

5. Walking through a crowd

Dog and handler walk close to several people; dog may show causal interest but not jump up.

6. Sit and down on cue/Staying in place

Handler shows that dog can do both sit and down, then chooses a position, leaves dog and goes to the end of a 20 ft. line, and returns immediately.

7. Coming when called

With dog still on 20 ft. line from Test 6, handler walks out 10 ft. and calls the dog.

8. Reaction to another dog

Two handlers and dogs approach, pretend to shake hands (hands 6-12" apart), exchange pleasantries, then move on.

9. Reaction to distractions

Distractions are presented; dog may not panic or show aggression.

10. Supervised separation

Handler goes out of sight for 3-min. Dog is held on a 6-ft. leash by an evaluator.

About the AKC Community CanineSM Title

AKC Community CanineSM is the advanced level of the AKC's Canine Good Citizen Program. Dogs who pass the AKC Community Canine test earn the official AKC Community Canine title that is designated by the letters "CGCA" (Advanced CGC) on the dog's title record.

Whereas Canine Good Citizen tests are most often tested in a ring and situations are simulated (e.g., 3 helpers serve as a "crowd"), the AKC Community Canine test is done in real situations including at shows, classes, and in the community.

AKC Approved CGC Evaluators administer the AKC Community Canine test.

Age Requirements for Dogs

There is no age limit for dogs taking the AKC Community Canine test. However, before taking the test, dogs must have a Canine Good Citizen test on record at AKC.

There are several exceptions to having no age limit at an AKC Community Canine test. When AKC Community Canine tests are given in conjunction with AKC events, clubs enforce the regulations for all activities.

Collar, Leashes and Equipment

All tests must be performed on leash. Dogs should wear well-fitting buckle or slip collars (including martingales) or body harnesses. Body harnesses should not restrict the movement of the dog. Special training equipment such as pinch collars and head collars are not permitted. The leash should be made of either leather or fabric. Retractable leashes may not be used in the test.

We recognize that special training collars may be valuable equipment in the beginning stages of dog training, however, we feel that dogs are ready to be tested after they have been transitioned to a slip or buckle collar (body harnesses are also acceptable). If an evaluator is teaching classes and does not feel comfortable with one of the permitted collars, students may be required to take the test in the type of collar used in class (as long as it is

permitted by AKC for testing). If the test is advertised for the general public, all of the permitted collar types and body harnesses should be allowed in the test.

Fees

Test-giving organizations and individual evaluators may charge a fee for conducting an AKC Community Canine test. Fees are used to cover the costs of test kits, mailing, copying, and advertising related to the test. Private trainers sometimes charge a fee for a testing session that is commensurate with their hourly rate of service. There is a \$25.00 processing fee that the dog owner will pay to the AKC for the AKC Community Canine title.

Food

Handlers are not permitted to use food as a reward during the AKC Community Canine Test. While we recognize that food can be an effective reinforcer during training, it should not be used in the test. As with CGC, the purpose of the AKC Community Canine test is to determine if the dog relates to the owner and if it can be controlled without food.

Handler/Dog Interactions During Test

Handlers may talk to their dogs and provide praise throughout the test. The test items should be in as natural, realistic format as possible. Evaluators should encourage the test to be fun.

Evaluators may remind handlers to communicate with their dogs. Evaluators should not make the test easier by eliminating test items, nor should they require a higher level of performance than the test requires. Of course, evaluators may choose to teach more advanced skills in their classes.

AKC COMMUNITY CANINE TEST

Advanced Canine Good Citizen (the "CGCA" title)

To earn the CGCA title, the dog must:

- 1. be registered or listed with AKC (AKC number, PAL, or AKC Canine Partners number) and,
- 2. already have a Canine Good Citizen award/title on record.

Dogs must pass all 10 items of the test to receive the CGCA title.

- 1. Dog stands, sits or lies down and waits under control while the owner:
 - sits at the registration table and fills out paperwork, or,
 - if the test is done in the community, dog waits while the owner sits and has a snack or visits with another person (e.g., at a park)
- 2. Walks on a loose leash in a natural situation (not in a ring) does not pull.
 - left turn
 - right turn
 - o stop
 - o fast and slow pace
- 3. Walks on loose leash through a crowd:
 - o at a show or in class, this item is tested in a real crowd, not in a ring
 - in the community, dog walks on sidewalk, through a crowd at a community fair, park, on a trail, through a busy hallway, etc.
- 4. Dog walks past distraction dogs present; does not pull.

This item may be tested along with #3 if there are dogs in the crowd, etc.

- o at a show or class, dog walks by dogs waiting in the crowd–dogs 2 ft. apart
- o in the community, dog walks by other dogs on a trail, sidewalk, in a hallway, etc.
- 5. Sit-stay in small group (two other people with dogs, total of 3 people, 3 dogs in group).
- 6. Dog allows person who is carrying something (backpack, computer bag, etc.) to approach and pet it.
- "May I pet your dog?" (Item is placed on floor/ground before the person pets the dog)
- 7. "Leave it." Dog walks by food and follows owner instructions, "Leave it."
 This can be food placed by the evaluator on the floor or ground in a food dish with a wire cover as in Rally.
- 8. Down or sit stay distance (owner's choice).
 - Dog is on 20-ft line, owner walks away with back to dog, picks up an item (e.g., backpack, training bag,

clipboard, folder etc.) placed on the floor/chair/ground by the evaluator and returns to the dog.

9. Recall with distractions present (coming when called). Handler goes out 20–ft. **(off center) and calls dog.

Dog is on the 20–ft. line from #8 above.

10. Dog will sit or stand stay (owner's choice) while owner enters/exits a doorway or narrow passageway.

Owner calls dog through door when ready.

Owner may also choose to:

- 1. send the dog through first and have the dog wait for the owner, or
- 2. the owner may choose to have the dog go through the doorway at the owner's side.

Whichever method is used, the dog must not pull the owner and must be under good control. Think of the handler having the leash in one hand and a cup of coffee in the other.

Doorway or gate can be real or simulated with ring gates, two chairs, or a natural passageway (e.g., entrance to trail) in the community.
